That first year alone, he sold 50 apartments and in 2008, in spite of the recent financial collapse, Eric founded Modern Spaces, forever changing the face of Real Estate in the area. After weathering the storm of a down economy, the company has grown to be the leading brokerage and marketing firm in LIC. In just six short years, Eric has expanded the company to offices in LIC, Manhattan, Astoria, and Brooklyn. Modern Spaces has captured a grand total of $70 \%$ of the market share of Long Island City and has successfully marketed over \$1 billion in sales to date.

In 2009, Eric was recognized by Mayor Michael Bloomberg as one of 40 under 40 Queens Rising Stars and later, he was recognized by Brooklyn Borough President Marty Markowitz as one of 40 under 40 Brooklyn Rising Stars. Eric was the first person to be awarded the honor in both boroughs.
