

Ivan Menchell ('74) writer/producer...

Ivan's Broadway credits include Bonnie & Clyde (book), Chitty Chitty Bang Bang (additional material), and The Cemetery Club. Off-Broadway/Tours include Smiling Through (book), The Prince & The Pauper (book), and The Surprise Party. For the screen, Mr. Menchell wrote an adaptation of his play, The Cemetery Club, starring Ellen Burstyn, Diane Ladd, and Olympia Dukakis; is co-writer of Samuel Goldwyn's Napoleon; and served as a writer on Universal's animated feature, Curious George. An Emmy nominated television writer, he created the critically acclaimed Showtime series, Bedtime and has served as Writer/Co-Executive Producer on the Disney Channel series Phil of The Future and JONAS, starring the Jonas Brothers. He was also a Writer/Supervising Producer on the long-running CBS comedy The Nanny, and the FOX dramatic series Time of Your Life, starring Jennifer Love Hewitt.

Currently, Ivan is adapting the French film, Disco, for Neil Moritz (Original Film) and has just finished writing Faces & Fuzzies, a television comedy pilot for Universal. He is also readying his new musical, Excalibur, for a March 14 opening in Switzerland and writing the musical Death Note for a 2014 opening in Tokyo and Mata Hari for a 2015 opening in Seoul. His feature film, Blended, starring Adam Sandler and Drew Barrymore, will be released Memorial Day, 2014.

Ivan is a graduate of the Yale School of Drama and the recipient of a Fulbright fellowship for his playwriting, which took him to Israel, where he lived and wrote for a year. His play, The Cemetery Club, about three Jewish widows who meet every month to visit their husbands graves, has been performed around the world in over a dozen languages, including long runs in Stockholm, Berlin, Tokyo, and Moscow.
